~~For altering the place of holding Courts in the County of Randolph, for erecting public Buildings thereon, [For appending] Commissioners to be appointed.~~

Whereas it appears that the present Situation of the Courthouse of Randolph County is remote from the Center of the same; and whereas by a Petition from the Inhabitants of said County, the present Place of holding Courts ~~is~~ is very inconvenient to a Majority of the Inhabitants thereof;

Bill enacted by the General Assembly of the State of North-Carolina, and it is hereby enacted by the Authority ~~of the State of North-Carolina, and it is hereby enacted by the Authority~~ of the same, that ~~James~~ Farmers, Duncan, Mr. Bell, Tom Humpfield, Edmund Maddall, Andrew Ramsey,

be, and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to view, ascertain and fix on a place nearly central in said County, to consist of ten Acres of Land, for the Purpose of erecting a Courthouse, Prison &c &c; - and that the Commissioners aforesaid have sufficient Power, either to sell the Present Courthouse, Gaol & Stocks at Public Sale, and apply the money arising therefrom in the erection of others on the place which may be fixed on by them in Virtue of this Act - or otherwise to take down and remove the present Public Buildings from the place whereon they now stand, and again to erect them on such place as they shall determine ^{to} near the Center of said County -

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that immediately after Public Buildings be erected on the place which may be concluded on by the Commissioners appointed by this Act, and Notice having been by them given to the Court of said County, that the same are in Readiness, the Justices of the Peace of said County, who form the Court thereof, there are here by directed and required to adjourn ^{the Court in Congreg} to the place and Courthouse by this act constituted and established - at which place when

when Adjourned, the Proceedings ~~hereby~~^{which may be} of the Court of
the said County, as well as the Business, carried on thereby until
the Time of the aforementioned and required Adjournment may
occur, and shall not be finally discontinued and ended, shall
nevertheless be determined and concluded at the Place of Holding
Courts as by this Act Appointed and established — and
the Clerk of said County is hereby directed and required to
remove all Records, Books & Papers of a Publick Nature, which
accrue said County or otherwise in his Care — also all Dockets
Trial Papers and others relating to Business in said Court,
to the Intent that Regular Proceedings of the Court of said County
may be continued and carried on in an uninterrupted Manner
as tho' the said Court had not Adjourned to the Place aforesaid

And Be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid
that the aforementioned 10 Acres of Land which may be
fixed on for the purpose aforesaid, shall be laid off by the
Surveyor of the said County, & Valued by a Jury to be chosen by
the Court — which Valuation shall be paid to the Owner of said
Land, out of the County Tax, who upon receiving such Con-
sideration is hereby required to execute a Deed for the same
to the Chairman, in behalf of the Court of said County, for the
use of the County forever —

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid
that for carrying into Execution the Intention of this act, that
a Tax not exceeding Three Pence one each Pole, and Three Pence
on each Hundred Acres of Land in said County, be laid and
collected by the Sheriff thereof, and appropriated by the Common-
wealth for the purposes aforesaid —

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid
that the former Act which Constituted and Established the present
Courthouse & other Buildings, where they now stand, be, and
